NAA Indoor Format

Recurve Bow - Two rounds of 60 arrows (120 total) at a 40 cm target face (choice of single-spot or triple-spot face) from 18 meters with outer ten-ring scoring.

Compound Bow - Two rounds of 60 arrows (120 total) at a 40 cm target face (choice of single-spot or triple-spot face) from 18 meters with inner ten-ring scoring.

JOAD Format

Recurve Bow- 60 arrows from 18 meters; **Juniors and Cadets** - 40 cm target face (choice of single-spot or triple-spot face from 18 meters — must use choice for entire tournament); outer 10 ring; **Cub and Bowman** - 60 cm target face; outer 10 ring

Compound Bow- 60 arrows from 18 meters; **Juniors and Cadets**, - 40 cm target face (choice of single-spot or triple-spot face from 18 meters — must use choice for entire tournament); use inner 10 ring; **Cub and Bowman** - 40 cm target face (choice of single-spot or triple-spot face from 18 meters — must use choice for entire tournament); use outer 10 ring

******NAA Dress Code enforced...this includes official practice sessions******

******* Change: All lines of indoor competitions that have multiple shooting times will be the same format--double line with (A and B lines). Official Practice is limited to 2 ends.***

Requirements

1) MEMBERSHIP - NAA or NFAA Membership is required for all competitors. Membership in a JOAD Club is also required for the JOAD Indoors. NFAA members must enclose a copy of their current (through March, 2008) membership card, with their tournament Registration Form. If your NAA membership expires prior to the official start date of the tournament, your NAA membership renewal must accompany your tournament Registration Form.

Your application will not be considered complete until your current membership is on file. Please be prepared to show NAA or NFAA membership card at the tournament registration table or be prepared to purchase a NAA membership at that time.

Should you need a duplicate membership card, please allow no less than 15 days prior to the tournament for requesting this card.

2) CITIZENSHIP - Competitors must be U.S. citizens and eligible according to FITA rules. Non-U.S. citizens will compete in Guest divisions.

3) YOUTH DIVISIONS-

- a) Participants may compete as a “Junior” through the calendar year of their 18th birthday (Born in or after 1990).
- b) Scores from the “Junior” & “Cadet” divisions will be used as qualifying scores for selection to the 2009 Jr. USAT Team.
- c) Participants may compete as “Cadet” through the calendar year of their 16th birthday (Born in or after 1992).
- d) Participants may compete as “Cub” through the calendar year of their 14th birthday (Born in or after 1994).
- e) Participants may compete as “Bowman” through the calendar year of their 12th birthday (Born in or after 1996).

4) COLLEGE ARCHERY PROGRAM (CAP) - In order to compete as a CAP archer (and be recognized for these specific division awards), the participant and the Institute of Higher Learning (the school) must have CAP status as determined by the CAP Registrar. Details can be found in the CAP Handbook, but roughly, the school must be registered with the NAA as a club member (the fee is waived for first year programs) and the archer must be a member of the NAA and currently registered and attending a single school as a full-time student (as defined by the school attended). Simply signing up though the NAA membership application as a Collegiate or via the event registration form WILL NOT SUFFICE. **To obtain CAP status, archers, through the school's Archer Representative, must submit proof to the CAP of the following, PRIOR TO THE COMPETITION EVENT AND NO LATER THAN FEBRUARY 15th: 1) School being represented currently maintains club status with the NAA and is associated with the CAP; 2) Archer is registered with the NAA and can be considered CAP Eligible via submissions to CAP Registrar with a CAP Eligibility Form:**

The CAP will verify status of each CAP entry for all CAP events and confirm receipt of CAP registration by US Indoor hosting clubs from all regional sites. Archers who have not provided the necessary paperwork, will be disqualified and will not receive awards (loss of CAP eligibility for the year may also be a result). **CAP archers need to register in the appropriate age class and also indicate their eligibility to shoot in the CAP on the entry form. Archers will shoot one complete round and their names will appear on both the National Indoor and the CAP Indoor Championships.** *NOTE: CAP archers having a GPA of 3.0 or better have an opportunity to earn All-Academic honors by placing in the top 25% in their respective divisions at this event. Applications for this honor will be made available at a later date via the CAP website.*

5) ENTERING MORE THAN ONE CLASS - An archer may compete in more than one discipline (i.e., Compound or Recurve), but may not compete in more than one age category within the same discipline. Separate fees and a separate Registration Form are required for each discipline in which an archer shoots.

6) WHERE TO ENTER: Participants may compete at any one of the above locations. Residents of each region will have registration priority should any one location reach full capacity.

7) CONFIRMATION: Only if your requested start time cannot be honored will you be sent a confirmation with your actual start time. All other information is included in this registration package. Please save it for reference. Register early!
